

**Tenure-track Faculty Position
Assistant/Associate Professor
Program Director
Mental Health Counseling**

The Department of Psychology invites applications for a full-time, 9-month academic year, tenure-track associate professor to serve as the Program Director for the department's CACREP-accredited Mental Health Counseling master's program.

The Department of Psychology has approximately 20 FTE faculty members, over 200 undergraduate majors, and about 75 graduate students in mental health counseling, school psychology, and experimental psychology. The department has a strong commitment to increasing the diversity of its faculty and student body. All university faculty are expected to practice effective teaching, conduct scholarly activity, and perform professional and community service.

Responsibilities: Applicants should be prepared to a) serve as Director for the Mental Health Counseling Program, b) teach counseling-related courses at the graduate level, c) teach undergraduate psychology courses, and d) supervise counseling practica. All faculty in the Department of Psychology are expected to have: a) a commitment to scholarly activity, b) the ability to establish a productive research program, and c) the ability and interest in mentoring student research at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Minimum Qualifications:

- An earned doctorate in counselor education from a CACREP accredited program by September 16, 2020;
- A minimum of three years of full-time college teaching;
- Experience as a licensed clinician in the field of counseling and license eligible in the state of WA (LMHC). Applicants will need to speak to a plan of getting LMHC by the end of the first academic year;
- Multicultural competence and experience working with diverse populations

Preferred Qualifications: Preference will be given to those applicants who meet the following criteria:

- Strong professional identity as a counselor educator
- Record of scholarly productivity
- Directorship experience and/or experience in a leadership position within a CACREP counseling program
- Advanced training in and experience providing clinical supervision
- Graduate coursework in psychology

Salary Range: Dependent on qualifications and experience.

Employment Conditions:

Pursuant to contract negotiations by the United Faculty of Central and Central Washington University, employment conditions are subject to collective bargaining.
